- Grab means 'to take advantage of an opportunity to do or have something.'

- Execution means 'the act of doing a piece of work; putting into action'.
- 7. Desirable means 'that you would like to have or do'.
- 8. In the context of the passage 'analyse' fits the blank appropriately.
- 9. In the context of the passage all other options are irrelevant.
- 10. Nebulous means 'not clear; vague'.
